MONITORED CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS SAVE LIVES

During a March snowstorm, the power went out in a residence in New Jersey and a recently purchased generator turned on. The family was home and relaxing at the end of the day, not knowing that their generator was pointed the wrong way and venting deadly carbon monoxide gas into the home.

Upon receiving an alarm signal from the monitored carbon monoxide detector, ADT called the residence to alert them to the potential danger, while explaining the importance of exiting the home until first responders arrived. ADT notified the fire department; upon arrival, they immediately detected high levels of carbon monoxide. They turned off the generator, opened the windows, and cleared the home prior to letting the family back inside.

In the words of our customer, without ADT, the family would have gone to bed that night and tragically, could have been among the 500 Americans killed every year by carbon monoxide poisoning.

How can I prevent CO poisoning in my home?

- Never run a car or truck in the garage with the garage door shut.
- Never use a generator indoors or in a garage, carport, or basement.

HOME SECURITY TIPS: 4 UNIQUE USES FOR YOUR SECURITY SYSTEM

There are many types of everyday technology that we take for granted. We are all a bit guilty of only using the surface capabilities of the devices we own. When was the last time you examined your security system and considered all the features available? Between basic features and home automation options, there may levels of security you never thought of that that could greatly further your peace of mind!

Pin-Code Customization

Did you know that with your home alarm system, you can set specific pin codes for every member of your family? This often-overlooked feature can create a more transparent and safer household for everyone. One useful application of pin-code customization is to give your children each a specific pin-code. This will help you monitor everything from when they get home from school to accurately tracking your teen's curfew. You can also assign specific pin-codes to each service provider (home watch, housekeeper, etc). With each pin-code unique to the user, they won't be interchangeable and can be changed at any time.

Cabinet Monitoring

Many people forget to think about the various nooks and crannies inside their home. If you have cabinets in your home that need monitoring (i.e., a medicine cabinet or gun cabinet), your home security system can monitor anytime someone enters the cabinet. This is also an effective way to add security to a home safe. By utilizing sensors on your cabinets and safe, you will be immediately notified if this area has been breached. Adding this level of monitoring to your home can help manage risks associated with burglary or potentially dangerous items. This type of monitoring can be especially useful if you have small children or elderly people living with you. So whether you are trying to keep your children out or confirm that seniors in your life are regularly taking their medication, you will be notified of any activity.

Pool Security

Many people don't consider the security of their hot tub or pool, but to keep your guests and family members safe, you need more than just constant supervision. This is why a camera system is one great way to help ensure that everyone keeps having fun and stays safe. The CDC states that about 10 people per day die from unintentional drowning in the United States. Having cameras specifically for your outdoor pool area can help to provide a much safer space against the common causes of pool accidents. Since you are able to access your cameras from any smart phone, you will always be in the loop. While no amount of home security cameras can compensate for parental supervision when it comes to your young ones going for a swim, it is a great addition to help provide additional security.

Monitor Your Deliveries

With instances of package theft on the rise, it's important to consider what steps you take to monitor when your package has arrived. With an integrated doorbell alarm, you create a layer of transparency that aims to eliminate worries about stolen deliveries. This doorbell alarm will notify you any time your bell rings, so you can know exactly when the mail carrier has come.

CYBER TIPS FROM HOMELAND SECURITY

The majority of cybercriminals do not discriminate; they target vulnerable computer systems regardless of whether they belong to a home user, a business, or are part of a government agency. However, there are steps you can take to minimize your chances of an incident.

- Set strong passwords, change them regularly, and don't share them with anyone.
- Do not include names or well-known information about yourself in your password.
- Increase password complexity by including symbols, punctuation, and upper & lower case letters.
 Example: Apple Jacks can be AppleJ@ck\$
- Optimize you system and software by installing recommended updates.
- Use privacy settings and limit the amount of personal information you post online.
- Be cautious about offers online if it sounds too good to be true, it probably is.

CAR THEFT—DON'T BE A VICTIM

The most recent FBI Uniform Crime Report shows a car is stolen every 41.2 seconds, and over 700,000 cars are stolen every year. A recent presentation by the Palm Beach County Sheriff's department reported organized car thieves are using teenage crews - often just 14-16 years old. Once stolen, the car is given a new VIN and is gone. Often the thefts are for quick profit and include common car makes such as Ford, Honda, Toyota, Acura, BMW, and GM vehicles. Parts from these models are in demand for resale too. One of the most commonly resold parts is airbags.



Whether your car is parked at home or in a crowded lot, lock the doors and take the keys with you. Prospective thieves walk down residential streets or go from car to car in shopping center parking lots testing door handles in search of unlocked cars. Once they get inside the car they look for a key and often find them "hidden" in the center console, the glove compartment, or under the seat. As high as 50% of stolen cars are unlocked at the time of the theft, and 1 in 8 have keys left inside. As vehicle security systems become more sophisticated, car thieves are starting to stage home break-ins to steal the keys instead. Home owners with open garage doors make choice targets.

Avoid being a target with just a few simple precautions:

- 1. Lock your car door & take your keys with you
- 2. Close your overhead garage door
- 3. Lock your interior garage door

- 4. Remove valuables from your car (purse, laptop)
- 5. Keep garage door openers out of sight
- 6. Use and arm your home security system
