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PROTECTING YOUR HOME

Although we all know that prevention is important, most people don't take the steps they need to help protect their home and family. Whether it's installing a monitored home security system, or just being able to identify potential risks of hidden dangers, such as fire and carbon monoxide throughout your home, these precautions can help create a safer environment to live in and save your life.



So what can you do better to help protect your home and family?



THE FRONT DOOR

A locked front door is your first line of defense. Deadbolt locks are recommended. Another good investment is a peephole. 180-degree peepholes give you the advantage of checking to see who's at the door before you open it. If you can't see who's at the door, don't open it. Make sure that the area outside your door is well-lit.



JUST MOVED IN?

If you've just moved into your new home, it's a good idea to replace all the locks. Locks only provide security if you know who has every key. The only keys to your new home should be the ones you have made.

A WINDOW OF OPPORTUNITY?



Make sure your windows have quality closures so they can't be pryed open. Motion or glass break detection should be a part of your security system for interior protection. *If you don't have motion or glass break detectors, a burglar can enter your home by breaking a window or glass door without triggering the alarm, even if your alarm is set!*

Keep any trees or shrubs around windows trimmed. While they may seem to increase your privacy, they also increase a burglar's privacy while they're breaking into your home.



IN THE SPOTLIGHT

Two of a burglar's biggest enemies are noise and light. Installing lights around your home that are activated by movement can help scare off unwelcome visitors. Exterior sensor lights also help to light the path to your front door when you come home. It's also a good idea to use timers to light inside areas of your home if you're home alone or away.

A monitored security system is your best protection. A monitored system doesn't just make a lot of noise, it sends an emergency signal to our monitoring center so our highly-trained security professionals can respond and dispatch help.

Devcon protects your home; who protects your identity? Hopefully you are!

What can you do to protect yourself? The first rule is so simple it almost seems silly. Be careful. Don't put anything on a computer that you wouldn't discuss over coffee or cocktails. Personal information is just that, personal. This is especially true on Facebook. Every legitimate business, financial or credit entity will tell you the same thing. "We don't ask you to tell us information we already know to verify who you are."

Use the tools that are available to you, many of which are free. Pay attention to the security e-mails you receive. For example, when you add a payee to on-line bill pay, most banks notify you quickly. If YOU didn't add that, react quickly and contact them. You receive an e-mail: "Your password has been changed". Again if YOU didn't change it, quickly contact them and don't use the address or phone number in the e-mail.

- If you get a phone call or e-mail from a bank or credit company, don't call back to the number they give you. . Call the preprinted numbers on the back of your debit or credit card.
- Be careful of e-mail & on-line offers. "You have been approved for..." If you're interested, look up the contact information independently and call them.
- Don't use passwords like birthdates, etc. They are easy to guess. •
- Consider subscribing to credit services. Most provide monthly reports--look at them. Many notify you when new credit activity occurs on your account. If you lose your wallet or a credit card, report it quickly.
